

"I use an oversize **William Yeoward** wineglass called the Olympia Burgundy (\$76; williamyeowardcrystal.com) for cocktails. It's literally 11 inches tall. When you come over, you have a big drink and you have one big drink. Of course, if you want more, you can have more, but you don't spend your time constantly refilling a glass. I serve a



"At a birthday party, of course, the cake is very important. Lady M. makes a crepe cake with whipped cream, which is divine (Lady M. Mille Crepes, \$40 for 6" and \$75 for 9"; ladym.com). If you're hosting a cocktail party, on the other hand, people always want a little nibble or snack. I'm a huge fan of William Poll for hors d'oeuvres



"At home I use Flowers by Zezé (\$250; zezeflowers.com)—my favorites are garden roses or peonies—but when I entertain outside of the house I go to David Monn, who will create a whole atmosphere." (davidmonn.com).



"I collect blue-and-white porcelain, so I have a lot of antique Chinese serving pieces. With those I use Canton dinner plates from **Mottahedeh**. They go in the dishwasher; if one breaks, it's not the end of the world. I have 60 of them. They're an easy thing to use, and they look pretty." (\$55 each; mottahedeh.com)
