n interior by Alex Papachristidis is nothing if not glamorous. But his is a distinctly comfortable brand of allure. The New York-based designer blends elegant one-off details—custom sofas embellished with trims and tassels, carefully vetted antiques, glimmering handpainted wallpapers-with a keen sense for how people actually want to live. "I love the rarefied and the unique, but it all has to be approachable," he says.

In a Papachristidis space, the velvet-covered cushions are plump, the Louis XVI chairs are arranged for conversation, and a gueridon to set a drink on is never far from reach. "It's called the living room because you're meant to live in it," he says. "I believe a house should be used." The dog lover is also fond of motifs from the natural world. His work has incorporated such details as crouching porcelain monkeys and exotic animal prints; bedrooms with fabric-covered walls

"I take decorating very seriously, but I like there to be some whimsy."

- · "Throw something sculptural and modern in with the antiques. If everything has a provenance, it can start to feel like your grandmother's house."
